

Polish violinist Emilia Jarocka is a winner of numerous national and international competitions, including 1st prize in the VIII Georg Philipp Telemann International Violin Competition and 4th prize in the XIII International Competition for Young Violinists in Honor of Karol Lipinski and Henryk Wieniawski in Lublin. Emilia performed multiple times as a soloist with orchestras in Poland, such as Sinfonia Varsovia, Podlasie Philharmonic Orchestra, Oskar Kolberg Świętokrzyska Philharmonic Orchestra, Symphony Orchestra of the Artur Malawski Podkarpackie Philharmonic, Zenon Brzewski Warsaw String Orchestra.

Throughout the years Emilia has taken masterclasses with internationally acclaimed violinists, such as Midori Goto, Noah Bendix-Balgley, Bomsori Kim, Julian Rachlin, Lisa Batiashvili, Vadim Gluzman.

She performed at prestigious concert halls including Warsaw Philharmonic Hall, Tonhalle Zurich and Jordan Hall in Boston.

In season 2022/2023 she held a position of a concertmaster of the Jerzy Semkow Polish Sinfonia Iuventus Orchestra.

She has been awarded many scholarships, including the “Young Poland” scholarship organized by the Ministry of Culture and National Heritage (2014) and “Bridge to the future” (2022) organized by Globalworth Foundation & Julian Cochran Foundation.

In 2020 she graduated with a bachelor's degree from the F. Chopin University of Music in Warsaw, where she studied with Andrzej Gebski. Currently she is a student of Alexander Sitkovetsky at Zurich University of Arts.

Emilia plays on Johann Georg Schoenfelder violin from XVIII century.
